Cornwall Council weed control update

Following the objections from Town and Parish Council's to Cornwall Council's proposal to introduce weed control including the use of glyphosate. Cornwall Council have advised that for the remainder of this year, with the Town and Parish Council's help, they wish to progress a programme of environmental improvements. These will be through a series of interventions including enhancing the greenspace estate and targeted "hotspot" interventions, without the use of chemicals.

This will include reviewing their mowing cycles, enhancing sites for nature on roads and footpaths as well as manual activities such as widening overgrown paths, cutting back edges, and removing weeds from kerb lines. Cornwall Council propose to work closely with the Town and Parish Councils to ensure these interventions are targeted effectively. They also propose to engage with the Cornwall Association of Local Councils to seek advice on how best to involve Town and Parish Councils in finalising their approach, ensuring the additional funding delivers maximum benefit for local communities.

Unfortunately the Parish Council do not have the budget to deliver weed control this year, over the last couple of weeks we have received a number of complaints from residents about various areas in the Parish looking untidy with vegetation, residents can report these directly to Cornwall Council online via <https://www.cornwall.gov.uk/transport-parking-and-streets/roads-highways-and-pavements/report-a-problem-with-a-road-or-pavement/>

The Parish Council will consider delivering weed control, and the cost of delivering this, once Cornwall Council's position is known and if any funding will be provided to Parish Council's to assist with the cost of weed control, during their discussions for next years precept and the 2027/28 budget later in the year.

Small Grants Scheme Funding

Do you have an idea that could make a positive difference in our parish?

Feock Parish Council's Small Grants Scheme is designed to support local community groups and organisations that are based in, or work within, the parish. For the coming financial year, the Parish Council has allocated £2,000 to help fund projects that benefit our community.

Through MyFeock, the Parish Council's wellbeing initiative, we are keen to support activities that bring people together, improve wellbeing, and enhance the social and leisure opportunities available to parish residents.

Grants of up to £200 per organisation are available.

So far this year the Parish Council have been pleased to be able to support Devoran and Carnon Downs Village Halls and Carnon Downs Bowling Club.

We look forward to supporting projects that make a real difference in our community.

Cornwall bus network timetable changes from 26th July 2026

From 26th July 2026, a series of service changes will be introduced. These updates will take place earlier than the usual September service review, giving passengers more time to plan ahead. The changes are in addition to the previously announced summer service enhancements.

Many of these improvements have been made directly in response to customer feedback, particularly regarding service timings and route coverage. Their aim is to better meet the needs of passengers and improve overall journey experience.

One improvement is that service 32 which is presently using the Carnon Downs bypass and therefore not coming through the village is being re routed via Ponsanooth and Perranwell and coming through Carnon Downs via Old Carnon Hill. This is hourly and a daytime service Monday to Saturday.

The 493 service Truro to Feock has changes made to improve timetable reliability.

Cornwall Civic Award honour for Cllr Keith Hambly-Staite

We are delighted to announce that one of our Feock ward Councillors, Keith Hambly-Staite has been awarded a Cornwall Civic Award after being nominated by our Cornwall Councillor, Martyn Alvey.

Martyn has known Keith since 2017, when he was first elected as a Cornwall Councillor, by when Keith had already served on Feock Parish Council for many years. Throughout his time as a councillor, Keith has consistently gone well above and beyond his duties, leading projects that have delivered lasting benefits for residents and the wider community.

Keith was instrumental in securing Feock's involvement in the HAIRE (Healthy Ageing through Innovation in Rural Europe) project, which helped strengthen community connections, improve wellbeing, and reduce isolation. Project partners included the University of Exeter and villages and townships in England, France, Belgium and Holland. Its legacy continues through initiatives such as Community Connect, Active Feock, the Repair Café, outdoor gym equipment, and the appointment of an Information and Wellbeing Adviser.

More recently, Keith secured funding for the GWR Railway 200 Project, celebrating the area's mining and railway heritage while promoting walking, cycling, tourism, and community engagement.

Keith's vision, leadership, and commitment have made a significant and lasting contribution to the parish and surrounding area. He is a highly deserving recipient of a Civic Award.

We were thrilled to read from the surveys that the majority had great support from family, friends and neighbours to help them in the aftermath of the storm. We are very grateful to those people who offered to volunteer as part of the Emergency Plan to check in on people who may be isolated and we will be in touch with you soon as we progress production of the plan.

Despite the weather, local residents still turned out to support this fantastic community event.

Organised by MyFeock Community Hub, which Feock Parish Council are part of, the event brought together over 25 local groups, clubs, charities and organisations, all eager to showcase the wide range of opportunities available to people living in the parish and surrounding area.

Visitors had the chance to discover everything from bowling, gig rowing (including trying their hand on a rowing machine!), Hospital Radio, IT classes, Carnon Downs Community Association, the Repair Café, Cats Protection, local churches and U3A, to important community services including Carnon Downs Surgery, the local chiropractor and the St Feock Community Minibus.

Whether people were looking for a new hobby, ways to volunteer, opportunities to make new friends or information about local support services, there was something for everyone.

Families were kept entertained with free face painting and children's activities, while volunteers from The Hub Carnon Community Methodist Church kept visitors well supplied with a wonderful selection of homemade cakes, tea and coffee throughout the day. Their hospitality helped create the friendly, welcoming atmosphere that made the event such a success.

The positive feedback from exhibitors and visitors alike has been overwhelming. Many people commented that they had discovered clubs, activities and services they never knew existed right on their doorstep, while groups enjoyed meeting new members and making valuable connections with one another.

The success of the day has already sparked plans to make MyFeock What's On Live! an annual event, with the MyFeock Community Hub Steering Group already planning a return in June 2027.

A big thank you to everyone who supported the event either by attending on the day despite the weather or having a stall to showcase what they can offer to residents.

Repair Cafe

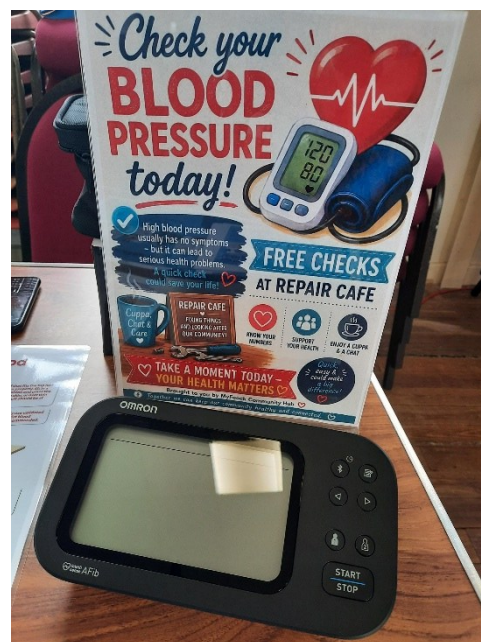
Don't throw it away – let us take a look!

Discover the Parish on Foot

Whether you're looking for a gentle stroll through the countryside, a scenic walk along the creek, or a peaceful woodland wander, Feock Parish is fortunate to have an extensive network of public footpaths, bridleways and byways connecting our villages. These routes are enjoyed by walkers, runners, dog owners, horse riders and nature lovers throughout the year and are one of the parish's greatest assets. Why not have a look at our Feock on Foot maps that are displayed on our noticeboards, available to download from our website or pick up a free copy from Devoran Community Library.

The Parish Council works hard to help keep this network open and accessible through a Local Maintenance Partnership with Cornwall Council. Under this agreement, the Parish Council is responsible for keeping the vegetation cut on the surface of the parish's public rights of way, helping to ensure routes remain safe and enjoyable to use.

Looking after the public rights of way is a shared responsibility. Landowners are responsible for maintaining hedges and side growth bordering public rights of way, as well as fences and stiles, while Cornwall Council is responsible for the surface of the paths, bridges and signposts. Understanding who is responsible for what helps ensure problems are dealt with as quickly as possible.

Help us keep our paths open

If you come across an overgrown or blocked path, broken signpost or any other issue while out walking, the quickest and most effective way to report it is directly to Cornwall Council using their online reporting system. Your report is logged immediately and you'll receive updates as the issue progresses. If the problem is surface vegetation please contact the Parish Council so this can be inspected.

To help identify the correct route, it is useful to include the path reference number. Every public right of way has its own unique reference, for example 305/57/1, where:

- 305 identifies Feock Parish
- 57 is the individual path number
- 1 identifies a spur or branch off that path

Including the reference number, a clear description of the problem and, where possible, a photograph of the issue will help speed up inspections and repairs.

Prioritising maintenance

As funding is limited, not every path can be maintained to the same standard.

Cornwall Council allocates funding based on a priority system of Gold for the highest priority routes, followed by Silver and then Bronze which may receive little or no maintenance.

This ensures the most frequently used and strategically important paths remain accessible throughout the year.

While enjoying our walks around the parish, you may also notice overgrown hedges, verges or vegetation encroaching onto pavements or highways. These should also be reported directly to Cornwall Council through their online reporting system who will contact the landowner to request they cut their hedge back, the timing will take into account bird nesting season. Reporting them promptly helps improve visibility, accessibility and safety for pedestrians, horseriders, cyclists and road users, particularly where vegetation restricts footways or highways.

The map below gives an overview of the network of public rights of way across Feock Parish. You can also download this as a PDF, together with a complete list of every footpath, including its reference number and description, on the Parish Council website. For those wanting to explore further, Cornwall Council also provides an interactive online map where you can zoom in on individual routes by selecting the Walking and Riding and Public Rights of Way layers.

Need to escape the heat?

During the hot weather, St Feock Church, Devoran Church and The Hub Carnon Community Methodist Church are opening their doors as Cool Spaces in the parish. If you need a break from the heat, you're welcome to pop in, cool down, relax for a while, and enjoy a complimentary glass of water

With high temperatures affecting the region it's important to look after yourself and avoid sunburn or heatstroke, and please look out for people who might struggle to keep cool, especially older people, children, babies, and those with underlying health conditions.

Here are top tips to beat the heat and stay well:

- Try to keep out of the sun between 11am to 3pm when the UV rays are strongest.
- If you have to go outside in the heat, walk in the shade, apply sunscreen (SPF 30-50) and wear a wide-brimmed hat.
- Close curtains on rooms that face the sun to keep indoor spaces cooler and remember it may be cooler outdoors than indoors.
- Drink plenty of fluids, avoid excess alcohol, take water with you if you're travelling.
- Never leave anyone in a closed, parked vehicle, especially infants, young children, vulnerable adults, or animals.
- Avoid physical exertion during the hottest parts of the day.
- If you are planning to go swimming in open water to cool down, take care and [follow local safety advice](#).
- Check medicines are being stored according to the instructions on the packaging.

Keeping your living space cool is especially important for those who need to stay at home while it's hot outside, here some tips to try to help you beat the heat indoors:

- Shade or cover windows exposed to direct sunlight and keep windows that are exposed to the sun closed during the day. External shutters or shades, if you have them, are very effective, while internal blinds or curtains are less effective. Care should be taken with metal blinds and dark curtains, as these can absorb heat.
- If possible and safe, open windows at night if it feels cooler outside.
- Turn off non-essential lights and electrical equipment – they generate heat.
- During the hottest periods find the coolest part of your home or garden/outside or local green space to sit in. If going outdoors, use cool spaces considerately.



Free bus travel for children this August

From 1st August to 31st August (inclusive), families can enjoy free bus travel for children across our networks, making it easier and more affordable to get out and explore everything Cornwall have to offer.

Whether you're heading to the beach, visiting family, enjoying a day out, or discovering somewhere new, leave the car behind and let us take you there.

School holidays can be an expensive time for families, with the cost of days out adding up before you've even arrived. By removing fares for children throughout August, we're helping families save money and enjoy more time together.



So, take advantage of free travel to visit attractions, parks, shopping destinations, beaches, cinemas and museums.

Great British Summer Savings

The Government's Great British Summer Savings campaign is helping families make the most of summer. Alongside free bus travel for children, families can also benefit from reduced VAT on selected attractions, including soft play centres, amusement parks and museums, helping make summer days out even more affordable.

- Children under 11 must be accompanied by a fare-paying adult or an adult travelling with a valid concessionary bus pass
- The offer applies only during the promotional period and is funded by the UK Government as part of the Great British Summer Savings initiative.
- Free tickets can only be issued on the bus the same day as you travel for every single journey.
- Normal Conditions of Carriage apply.
- If you're 16–18, please continue to buy a child ticket to when you travel.
- Excludes Truro Park and Ride.

The Parish Council submits consultee comments on planning applications within the parish in line with our Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP), taking into account any comments received from neighbours and other interested parties.

We also publish weekly updates on our Facebook page showing the planning decisions made by Cornwall Council on applications within the parish.

Parish Councillors welcome comments from residents and other interested parties, which are taken into consideration when deciding the Council's consultee response. However, it is important that you also submit your comments directly to Cornwall Council, as it is the local planning authority and is responsible for making the final decision on each application.

Even if you have emailed your comments to the Parish Council and/or attended a Parish Council meeting to express your views, you should also submit them to Cornwall Council.
