
### Inspiring Devoran Trails

Whatever the weather take a stop at the mouth watering Old Quay Inn.




# Syespy Syespy

### The Walk

Start at Devoran village hall.

Take a right turn up Market street.
You will pass the old school on your right.

After that you cross St Johns terrace.

Then you pass the church of St John and St Petroc on your left. Alternatively, you can walk up through the churchyard and check out the fascinating gravestones.

Continue up the farm lane to a stile on your left.

Over the stile and take the next turn right turn, along a farmers field.

This takes you past Devoran Middle Farm and you eventually climb over a stone stile.

After that you stroll down a quiet, calm lane with a handy bench if you want a rest!

Turn right and spring or undo the metal gate. Go through another two gates and walk along some wooded lanes until you get to a steep track where you can have a race down (please stop before you get to the small road at the bottom!)

### The walk continued.....

Take a right here and next left where you can see Devoran Quay ahead. This is a great place to stop and ENJOY!

You can walk on here but take care not to cycle.

To arrive back at the Village Hall (your start)- continue along Quay Road.
