#### Street lighting in Carnon Downs switched off

As part of the roll out across the County and that has already happened in Devoran, Cornwall Council will be switching off the street lights in Carnon Downs between midnight and 5am with effect from week commencing 4th August 2025.

As part of the roll out across the County and that has already happened in Devoran, Cornwall Council will be switching off the street lights across Cornwall to reduce light pollution and help meet the Council's ambition to become Carbon Neutral by 2030.

There has been a careful selection process, including liaison with local police, in choosing the most appropriate streetlights to switch off.

#### **Parish Community Emergency Plan**



The Parish Council has started to put together a Parish Community Emergency Plan to be activated in events such as adverse weather, a lengthy power cut, trees down blocking road access etc. to provide help to residents before the Emergency Services are able to assist.

We are looking to develop the Emergency Plan with help from residents and have started building a list of volunteers who may have the skills to help in an emergency - for example you may be able to use a chainsaw to remove a fallen tree, have a 4x4 vehicle or you may be able to go and check on neighbours and collect supplies for them.

We receive general enquiries requesting information come from a wide range of residents seeking reassurance and advice from a 'human' often following attempts to gain facts from online and digital sources. 'Chart toppers' include overgrowth of hedges and trees where this is impeding safe walking or likely to cause damage to property, boundary disputes, access lanes, inadequate signage, footpaths and rights of way issues. Streetlights and problem with the defibrillator phone boxes, moorings queries, ongoing foreshore issues, and annual forms for proof of residency are also things we deal with.

Supporting drop-in and phone callers with reporting incidents such as fly tipping, graffiti and potholes with online reporting on behalf of non-digital residents.

The Feock Parish Transport scheme has made **145 journeys** in the last year around the parish with the most popular destination being Perranwell Wellbeing Club, followed by Carnon Downs and Devoran surgeries. We have 10 regular customers. The lifts requested are vital for health and wellbeing; all at difficult venues to coordinate appointments with a convenient bus service and occur within 3 miles of home address.

A huge thank you go to our wonderful volunteer drivers who carried out all these journeys.

## Celebrating our railway heritage Exploring our past, discovering the present and enjoying being outdoors by Cllr Keith Hambly-Staite

Readers who watch commercial television will have seen the current GWR advertising campaign showing The Famous Five created by Enid Blyton rushing around the country in search of new adventures. A more local GWR sponsored campaign organised by Feock Parish Council will highlight the adventures that can be had by walking and cycling in the Carnon Valley and about Restronguet Creek.

With the strapline 'Explore, Discover, Enjoy' the campaign will engage with young people at Devoran School and the wider community about the historic mining and railway artifacts to be discovered in the valley and focus on the delights of the flora and fauna of the area. There is much to discover, whether around Devoran, a village created by the mining and railway industries, or by exploring the paths around the valley bottom. Where once barges owned by the Redruth and Chacewater Railway moored up on Devoran Quay today people can be found sailing or swimming during the summer and Osprey watching in the spring and autumn.

The Bissoe Trail runs through the Carnon Valley and is part of a larger group of trails collectively known as the Cornwall Mineral Tramway Trails. You can walk or cycle from Point to Portreath. But many people, particularly visitors, do not find their way to this extraordinary place close to our doorstep. One of the first things we are doing is to signpost ways to the Carnon Valley and the surrounding area from the railway station at Perranwell and highlight the car parks which cover the part of the valley within our parish. During the Autumn there will be talks at Devoran School and groups of children will be stimulated to explore their area with the help of an I-Spy booklet where they will find some of the remains of the railway and the mining industry. We want to encourage our younger residents and their families to explore the area like The Famous Five, to discover new things, have adventures and enjoy the outside world.



#### **Defibrillators in the Parish**

There are a number of public access defibrillators around the parish, most of which are maintained by the Parish Council, these are automated, anyone can use one, training is not necessary. The defibrillator will talk the user through how to use it and will not allow a shock to be given unless it detects that the heart is in a shockable rhythm. The defibrillators are located as below.


If you have cause to use/collect a defibrillator please return it to the phonebox you got it from or back to the Parish Council Office (open weekday mornings) so it can be checked and then put back into service and notify us that it is back. We automatically get notified by the online Circuit system when a caller to 999 has been directed to collect one of our defibs.

We understand that there will be times that someone may need to go and collect a defibrillator without being told to by 999 but if you do please can you tell us asap (by email to <a href="clerk@feockparishcouncil.gov.uk">clerk@feockparishcouncil.gov.uk</a> is best). This is so that we can mark the defibrillator as 'unavailable' on The Circuit system, otherwise if someone phoned 999 and were directed to collect a defibrillator and got there to find it missing then precious time could be wasted and lives put at risk.


